SCHEDULE

Ring 1 start 9am

- Class 1 In hand M&M pony open to registered and unregistered ponies, any age.
- Class 2 Ridden M&M pony- open to registered and unregistered ponies, any age.
- Classes 1 & 2 may be split between large and small breeds if sufficient entries
- Classs 3 Lead rein pony ridden by a child aged 8 years an under, pony not exceeding 128cm. M&M or plaited ponies. Lead rein to be attached to the noseband.
- Class 4 First ridden pony M&M or plaited, not exceeding 128cm, riders aged 10 years or under
- Class 5 Riding pony/SHP animals not exceeding 148cm for RP or 153cm for SHP, riders the correct age for the height of pony they ride
- Class 6 Coloured in hand any height or age
- Class 7 Coloured ridden, open to horses and ponies, will be split if sufficient entries
- Class 8 Veteran in hand open to horses or ponies aged 15 years or over
- Class 9 Veteran ridden open to horses or ponies aged 15 years or over, riders any age

Ring 2 start 9am

- Class 10
- Class 11 Ridden Arab open to full or part bred, riders any age
- Class 12 Ridden thoroughbred class open to any TB, riders aged 15 years or over
- Class 13 Riding horse/hack riders aged 15 years or over
- Class 14 Ridden hunter 158cm or over, riders aged 15 years or over
- Class 15 Ridden sports horse exceeding 148cm, riders aged 15 years or over
- Class 16 Ridden cob LW/HW/maxi riders aged 15 years or over
- Class 17 Best turned out judged on cleanliness and turnout of horse/pony & rider.

 Open to any height/age, may split should entries warrant.

- Class 18 Novice showing class open to those new to showing (never having won a first place in any showing class). May be split juniors/seniors if sufficient entries
- Class 19 Riding club horse/pony riders to be suitably mounted, may split if entries warrant
- Class 20 Best rider open to horses/ponies, riders any age but must be suitably mounted. May split if entries warrant.

Class 21 Family horse/pony

Ring 3

- Class 22 Lead rein/assisted WHP, fences not exceeding 30cm. Riders aged 10 years and under, ponies not exceeding 133cm
- Class 23 Working hunter fences not exceeding 50cm.
- Class 24 Working hunter fences not exceeding 60cm.
- Class 25 Working hunter fences not exceeding 70cm.
- Class 26 Working hunter fences not exceeding 80cm.
- Class 27 Working hunter fences not exceeding 90cm.
- Class 28 Working hunter fences not exceeding 1m.

Classes 23-28 are open to horse and ponies, riders to be suitably mounted. No horse or pony may jump in more than two classes. Riders will jump their round and all clears (or others with faults requested by judge) will come back into the ring for a go round and individual show. Should entries warrant class may be split horses/ponies.

Rules

Judges decision is final

Ridden animals must be aged 4 years or over

Spurs may only be worn by adult riders (on horses)

Hats to current standards to be worn at all times whilst mounted and are strongly recommended to be worn for in hand classes

Etc

Entry fee £8 in advance £10 on the day £3 per rider medical cover

- Entries will close 48 hours proceeding the competition. Times will be issued by 4pm 48 hours prior to the competition. Late entries will be taken at a £3 charge per class. If classes are full a waiting list will be kept.

- ☐ Withdrawals: In the unfortunate event of withdrawal, please advise the secretary by 9am on the Thursday prior to the competition.
- ☐ We regret no refunds will be made once times are issued.
- ☐ Times: Will be available online after 4.00pm 48 hours prior to the event. at www.solihullridingclub.co.uk/times
- ☐ Any special requests must be clearly put onto entry.
- ☐ Bridle numbers OR saddle pad numbers must be worn. **ONE ON EACH SIDE**
- ☐ Horses may only enter once in each class competitively.
- Any objections or complaints MUST be done so through a legitimate complaints procedure. You must place a £10.00 deposit alongside your written complaint. This complaint will then be assessed by the executive committee. If your complaint is found to be legitimate, you will be refunded your £10.00.

General Rules

HATS must be worn whenever mounted and should be to the correct current standard.

ONLY Jockey skull hats without a peak (greater than 5mm smooth and rounded in nature) may be worn for cross country. Hat silks may be worn with flexible peak. It must also comply with safety standards for hats.

BODY PROTECTORS A body protector is obligatory for all arena eventing and cross-country events and are also strongly recommended for all show jumping events. Body protectors should be fitted and worn as per the manufacturer's instructions. If a rider chooses to wear an airbag style body protector it must be worn over a permitted body protector and if activated, must be deflated or removed before continuing. Hybrid Air jackets and Helite Air Jackets are permitted. It is recommended that body protectors are replaced once they are more than 5 years old. Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the secretary at all events.

CORRECT dress & footwear with defined heels must be worn.

ALL horses and ponies must be four years old and over. **ALL Riders to be 4-years old and over**.

ENTRIES accepted at rider's risk. SRC reserve the right to refuse an entry at their discretion, cancel, amend or amalgamate any class for any reason whatsoever. The Judge's decision is final.

INSURANCE Each competitor must carry their own liability insurance whether Riding Club, Pony Club, BHS, BS, BD, BE or independent cover.

HEALTH & SAFETY The organisers of this event have taken reasonable precautions to ensure the health and safety of everyone present. For these measures to be effective everyone must take all reasonable precautions to avoid and prevent accidents occurring and must obey the instructions of the organisers and all the officials and stewards. Those attending this event must report any accidents to the secretary or organizer of the event.

Please do not leave unattended horses tied to lorries and no hay nets to be tied to the outside of lorries or trailers.

Solihull Riding Club welcomes responsible dog owners. Dogs must be always kept on a lead.
